





SITUATION

- Last year, the city had:
 - Over 1250 shooting victims (through 12/23)
 - Statistically, one person is shot every 6 hours and 51 minutes
 - 284 homicides by firearm
 - Through 12/30, 3398 gunpoint robberies
 - 2512 aggravated assaults with a firearm
 - 21.4 homicides per 100,000 people
 - NYC is typically around 6.5 , LA is 7.5, Dallas is 11.5



- More efficient prosecution.








•Two thirds of defendants in violent crime cases go free •Among large urban counties, Philadelphia had the lowest felonyconviction rate

Only 1 in 10 of people charged with assault with a gun were convicted
Only 2 in 10 charged with gunpoint robbery were convicted
Only about half of people charged with gun possession were convicted
There were convictions in only about 20% of violent crime cases, compared with about 50% nationally






3-STEP PROCESS FOR IDENTIFYING OFFENDERS

- 1. Identify hotspot for violence
- 2. Identify violent offenders and violent organizations that live or operate within the hotspot
- *3. Take action to disrupt violent individuals and organizations*

STEP ONE– IDENTIFY HOTSPOT


--Original area --Expanded area as of 4/12/12

PRIORITIZING OFFENSES

- New community based model makes each bureau responsible for tracking violence in their designated hotspot
- 4 basic tasks for Bureau Chiefs
 - 1) Track All Pending Cases of Priority Violent Offenders.
 - 2) Track all Non-fatal shootings within each Bureau.
 - 3) Track all VUFA cases within each Bureau.
 - 4) Connect with Community Groups Active in Hotspots.

EXAMPLE OF COMMUNITY OUTREACH REPORTING

- Total Number of Community meetings last 30 days:
 4
- Total Number of Sentencings involving a gun crime where a community witness presented at sentencing:
 3
- Total Sentencings of any type where community was present: 3

SMART ON CRIME

- Increased # of prosecutors in the Charging Unit
- Diverted non-violent offenses
 - Small Amount of Marijuana (SAM)
 Alternative Misdemeanant Program (AMP)

RESULT: Money and resources saved to concentrate on violent crime
